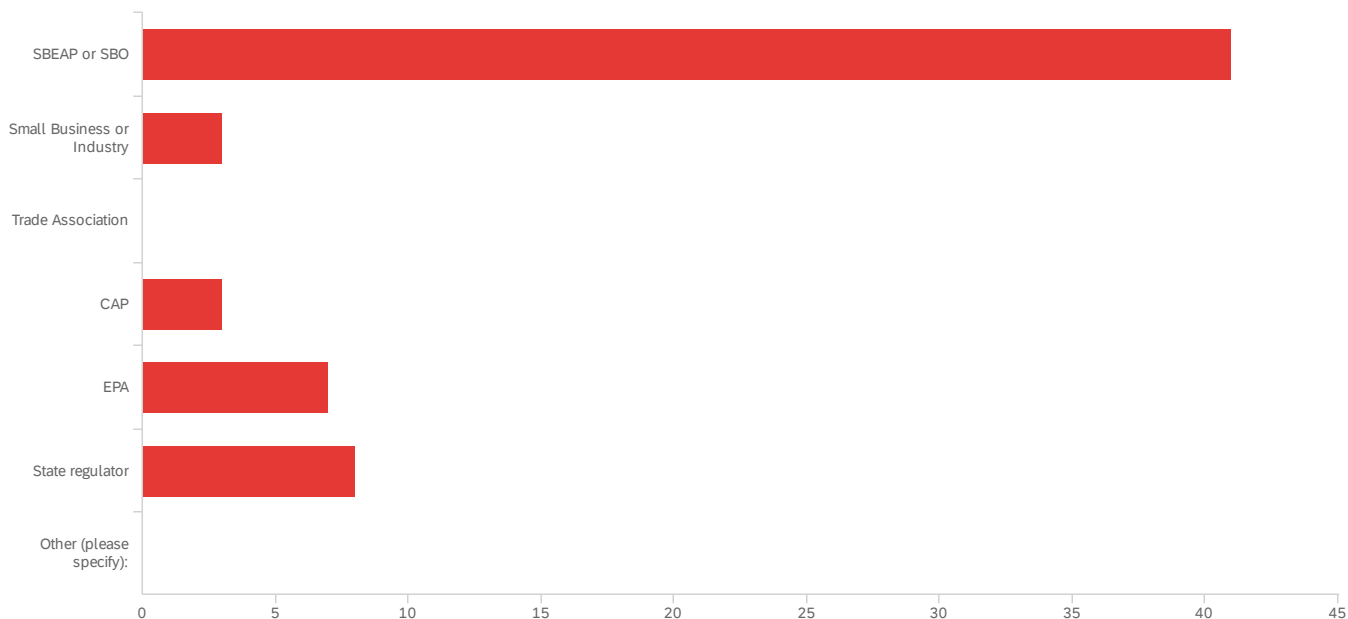

1 - Who are you representing (select all that apply)



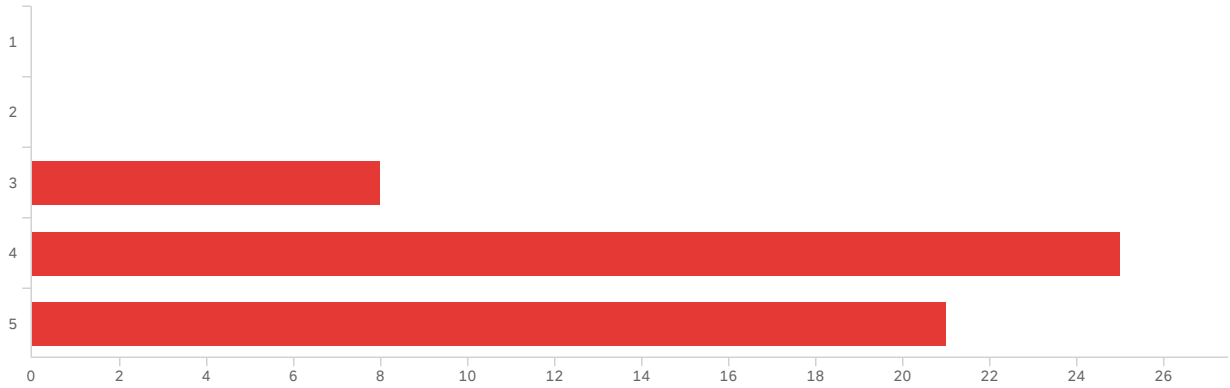

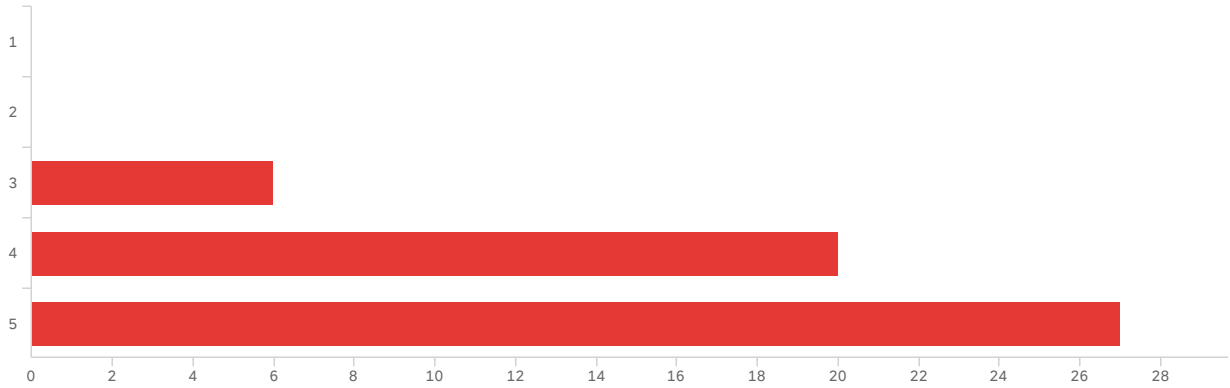

3 - On a scale of 1 to 5, how would you rank the importance of this information to your profession? (1 = "Not Important"; 5 = "Extremely Important")

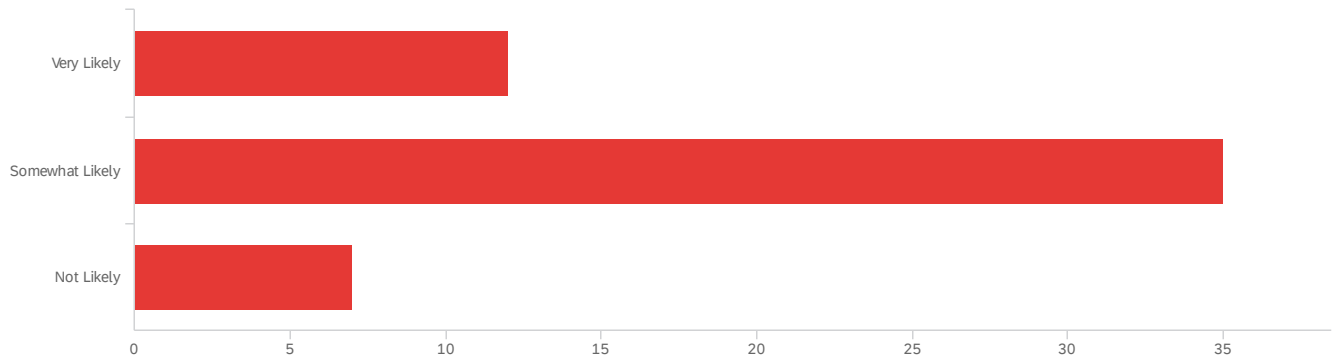

Speakers from EPA and federal updates. Nice to hear from fellow SBEAPs.

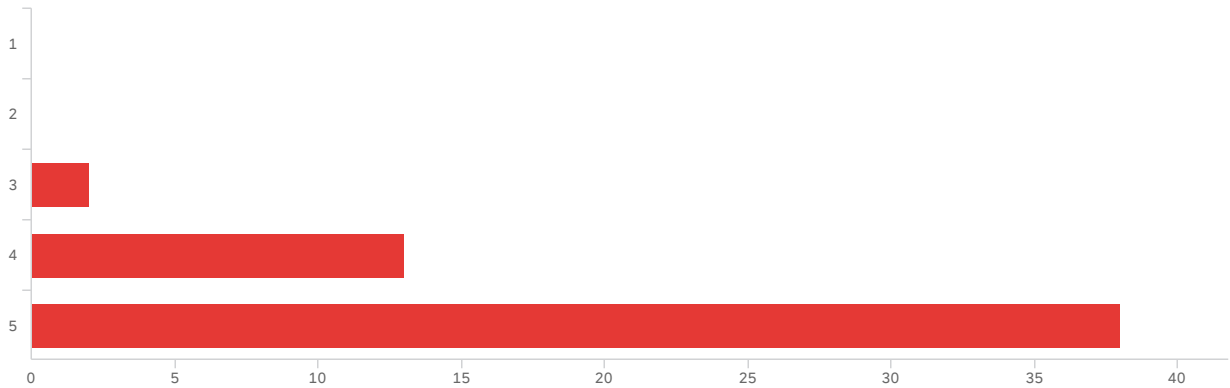
