• Despite travel and direct contact covid-related restrictions, the Program continued assisting small businesses with navigating environmental regulations primarily through email, Zoom, Teams, and phone correspondence. (The really big indirect win was that the usually computer technology-challenged Program manager (John) learned how to use Teams and Zoom proficiently to communicate with clients, well, sort of.)

- The Program executed an EPA-funded source reduction assistance grant aimed at the food and beverage industries in Montana. We assisted a water bottling company with using spring water to heat and cool the building, instituted waste reductions at a pasta manufacturing facility, and dialed-in efficiencies at a kombucha producer. The Program worked with the Montana State University's MT Manufacturing Extension Center on those source reduction assistance projects.
