

OAQPS SBAP Framework

The OAQPS Small Business Assistance Program (SBAP) is managed by the Community and Tribal Programs Group in OAQPS' Outreach and Information Division.

3

- The OAQPS SBAP serves as a central resource for States, EPA Regions, and small businesses to obtain information, tools, and training about OAQPS regulatory actions that may impact or be of interest to small businesses.
- Currently, 9 out 10 regional offices have one Regional Air Small Business Liaisons (RASBL) that engage with state representatives.
 - ► Approximately 10% of time available to support the OAQPS SBAP.
 - Region 6 is currently vacant.
 - Regions 8 and 10 have collaborated to work together. This is a pilot.
 - Regions 3 and 5 are still operating as multi-media support.

Coordination with Internal Partners

- Coordinate standing meetings with OAQPS SBAP workgroup and RASBLs to ensure state needs are heard and met.
 - ▶ Workgroup calls: February, June, and October.
 - Regional calls: April, August, December.
- Participate on workgroups for rulemakings to ensure small businesses are considered throughout the rulemaking process and to determine the most effective outreach strategy for those small businesses.
- Assist rule writers on developing documentation for SBAR panels.

Outreach to External Stakeholders

- Developing and conducting trainings/webinars for small business stakeholders (e.g., Oil and natural gas rulemaking).
- RASBL meet with SBEAPs and participate in states' regional meetings.
- Development of small business assistance outreach materials (e.g., fact sheets, brochures, etc.).
- Provide support to small business environmental assistance programs (SBEAPs) throughout and after the rulemaking process including participating in monthly calls with SBEAP representatives (e.g., SBEAP Technical subcommittee).
- Maintain an email listserv of small businesses and stakeholders that is used to communicate upcoming training and regulatory actions.
- Development of a small business webpage that houses information for small businesses, such as regulatory actions, Small Business Advocacy Review (SBAR) panel announcements, a calendar of upcoming events, and RASBLs contact information.
