# **US Government : World's Largest Buyer**

• The U.S. Federal Government is the single largest consumer in the world, spending more than \$645 billion on products and services each year. **Surpassed \$700B in 2022**.

# **Bipartisan Infrastructure Law**

- The US Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL): **\$1.2** trillion in federal investment to improve the nation's infrastructure, from transportation systems and power grids to broadband and other public works.
- \$1.2 trillion in total funding over ten years, including \$550 billion in new spending during the next five, divided between improving the surface-transportation network (\$284 billion) and society's core infrastructure (\$266 billion).



## WHAT YOU NEED TO DO TO GET STARTED

- Register on the System for Award Management (SAM)
  - FAR 4.1102 : Offerors and quoters are required to be registered in SAM at the time an offer or quotation is submitted
- Get a Unique Entity Identifier
- Obtain a North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code
- Confirm your Small Business Status on the Small Business Administration Website

- <u>SAM.gov</u>: Government agencies are required to use SAM to advertise all contracts over \$25,000. (Respond to RFI, Sources Sought, and Solicitations)






### FY 2022: R9 Contracts Awarded & Funds Obligated

#### 1000 Contract Actions Awarded

- 75% Superfund
- 14% Multi-Divisional (IT Services, Business Center, etc.)



#### \$70M Funds Obligated

- 77% Superfund
- 6% Multi-Divisional

## **EPA & BIL**

- More than \$50 billion for clean water projects, the single largest federal investment in water ever made.
- More than \$5 billion for cleaning up longstanding pollution at Superfund and brownfields
  sites and for making improvements to waste management and recycling systems, helping to
  restore the economic vitality of communities that have been exposed to pollution for far too long.
- \$5 billion for decarbonizing the nation's school bus fleet, improving air quality for more than 25 million children who ride the bus to school each day.
- \$100 million for the Pollution Prevention Program, including the launch of a new program focused on delivering environmental justice, which will help businesses reduce toxic pollutants, cut water usage, improve efficiency, and lower business costs, while better protecting the communities they serve.



# **Region 9: Major Contracts**

- Response, Assessment, and Evaluation Services (RAES) Contract (\$85M):
  - Single Award, Large Business
  - \$85M total potential ceiling
  - Purpose: Assessment of abandoned uranium mines on the Navajo Nation
  - Scientific and technical services for response, assessment, time-critical and non-time-critical removal actions, community involvement,
     data management, and training specifically for the Navajo Abandoned Uranium Mine program.
- Abandoned Mine Response & Construction Services (AMRCS) Contract (\$220M):
  - Multiple Award, Total Small Business Set-Aside
  - \$220M total potential ceiling awarded to three small businesses
  - Purpose: Cleanup of abandoned uranium mines on the Navajo Nation
  - Provide cleanup, response and construction services primarily at the former uranium mining-related sites under the Navajo Abandoned Uranium Mine program.
- Remedial Action Contracts (RAC): Architect and engineering services specializing in environmental study, evaluation and remedial design.\$400 M
- Remedial Action Framework (RAF):
  - Multiple Award Contracts replacing the Region's Single Award Remedial Action Contracts (RACs)
  - Task orders must be competed, unlike RAC

## **Small Business**

- Generate 62% of new jobs since 1995
- Comprise 97.4% of exporters
- Comprise 43.5% of gross domestic product

<u>Federal Acquisition Regulation:</u> Every federal government purchase with an anticipated value above the micro-purchase threshold of \$10,000, and up to the Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT) of \$250,000, is required to be automatically and exclusively set-aside for small businesses. Furthermore, the Federal Acquisition Regulation requires the contracting officer to set aside any acquisition over the simplified acquisition threshold (above \$250k) for small business participation when there is a reasonable expectation that (1) Offers will be obtained from at least two responsible small business concerns; and (2) Award will be made at fair market prices.

The Small Business Act requires negotiated small business goals and statutory goals for socioeconomic small businesses.



## **EPA 2023 Small Business Goals**

Small Business	44.7%
Small Disadvantaged Business	17.80%
Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business	3%
Women Owned Small Business	5%
HUBZone Small Business	3.2%
