Environmental Regulatory Assistance Resource for Small Businesses

Small businesses have a lifeline to call for environmental regulatory compliance issues. Mandated by federal law, every state must provide no-cost environmental technical assistance to their small business constituents. At a minimum, they must provide assistance with air quality compliance issues. Some programs provide assistance on other environmental regulations including water and waste.

This can mean real savings for small businesses that face a stiff learning curve for complex environmental regulations and potential costly fines and penalties for non-compliance. These savings add up when you consider that, according to the U.S. Small Business Administration, small businesses make up 99.7 percent of U.S. employer firms, 63 percent of net new private-sector jobs, 37 percent of high-tech employment and 98 percent of firms exporting goods.

The services provided in your state are part of a national network of Small Business Environmental Assistance Programs (SBEAP) which is coordinated through a National Steering Committee. In addition to providing free technical assistance to small business owners across the country, the program evaluates and comments on state and federal regulations and helps determine the appropriate paths to compliance.
